### Pensioner's Profile Seán Doyle

I was born on the 31<sup>st</sup> December 1923 and went to the Christian Brothers school in Nenagh where I obtained my Leaving Certificate. My first job was in the State Solicitors Office, James O'Brien & Co., Nenagh from 1944 to 1947.

I joined Irish Life Assurance on the 12<sup>th</sup> May 1947 working as a Rep in Thurles for 4 years and was then transferred to Roscrea. After that I was based in Nenagh as a Rep. In 1967 I was promoted to Inspector and was based in Carrick-on-Shannon for 2 years. I also worked in North Leitrim and part of Cavan, Roscommon and Sligo.

In 1956 I married Mary Aherne from Castlecranna, and we had 2 children, John and Marie.

A move to North Dublin saw me based in Raheny for 7 years. My promotion to District Manager in 1974 saw me leave the "big smoke" for Carlow (a district with 37 staff and 2 clerks). Wellington Quay in Dublin was my next base and my final years were spent in Marine Road, Dun Laoghaire (staff of 45 and 3 clerks). I retired in 1987 after 42 years' service. I wish to extend my sincere thanks to the staff of each District I worked in, both as District Inspector and District Manager for their support and loyalty and also the staff in Head Office.

During my long career at Irish Life and through many moves, I had an active social life. I always believed that a social life, as a volunteer or team member, was an important part of a person's rounded character and a beneficial to my career.

A meeting in 1947 with the late Padraig O'Meara (RIP) in the Nenagh Post Office was to have a big influence on me. He spoke to me "in Gaelic" and I felt ashamed I could only reply poorly in Irish.

I mentioned the experience to my parents and I was very glad that I followed their suggestion and joined Chonradh na Gáeilge. I became involved in all the activities this wonderful organisation run. I took particular pride in organising the Irish Dancing Competitions at the North Tipperary Show for 13 successive years. It was a very popular event and drew large crowds on the 15<sup>th</sup> August.

The Fainne pin is worn to show you have fluency and a willingness to speak Irish. The wearing of the Fainne has brought me many rewarding encounters, in business and in life. I have always been a proponent of the revival of the language.

I was also an avid participant in Amateur Drama while based in Nenagh often performing in Irish, a rarity at the time. My drama success is displayed in the Booklet "O'Gluin go Gluin" – Sceál Chonradh na Gáeilge in Aonoch Urún 1901 – 1993. I had the good fortune to win best Actors Awards at various festivals. I was privileged to be invited to the first filming of "Mise Eire" in Dublin.

Golf has been my passion since I worked as a caddie, as a boy in Nenagh, to earn extra money. I have been a member of various Golf Clubs over the years and have held many officerships including Captain of the Irish Life Golf Society. I was the first to win the Irish Life Managing Director's Cup in Carlow in 1956. I have accumulated a number of prizes on the golf course. I have always supported other players in the various clubs where I have been a member.

Mary and I have been happily married for 57 years. She is a member of our Active Retirement Group and plays "indoor" bowls with her friends.

My children now are grown up. John, my son is a journalist in Canada where he lives with his wife. His book "A Great Feast of Light: Growing Up Irish in the Television Age" was first published in 2005 and has since been published in 5 countries, including the U.K. and Ireland. My daughter, Marie works in U.C.D where she was recently conferred with a "Doctorate" on Irish literature.
